This year, the German-American Club Kaiserslautern (DAC KL) as part of its traditional donation program once again supported local organizations and projects that are particularly committed to strengthening German-American friendship. Their commitment was also recognized during the donation award ceremony.

"It is a particular concern of the members of the DAC KL to actively shape the coexistence of Germans and Americans in our region," emphasized the club's president in his address. "Only when people from different countries and cultures meet and spend time together do they begin to comprehend each other. This creates friendships.
